# **Important Information about Infectious Diseases**

## **Butterflies Childcare - Response, Policies and Procedures**

### Pre-cautionary measures in place

- We have sent out government guidance to parents and carers and will continue to update as new information emerges. - 2. Increased hand-washing practices within the setting and awareness of crosscontamination, focusing on 'Catch it, Kill it, Bin it'.
- 3. Introducing age-appropriate information relating to health and hygiene and practicing good hand-washing techniques.
- 4. Asking all visitors to sanitise hands on entry to the nursery
- Disinfecting high contact areas such as door handles and intercom buzzers at regular intervals throughout the day-concentrating on busier periods such as early morning/late afternoon.
- 6. Tightening sickness and exclusion policies and procedures for unwell children.

#### **Policies and Procedures**

- Any child or member of staff with a fever will be sent home at the first instance.
  We class fever as a temperature of 38°c or higher and showing symptoms of fever such as shivering and lethargy.
- 2. Any child or member of staff showing signs and symptoms of any infectious disease will be sent home and the appropriate exclusion period followed.
- 3. Any child or staff member returning from travel from the government listed 'Risk Areas' will be excluded from the setting following the latest government advice found at <a href="https://www.gov.uk/guidance/coronavirus-covid-19-information-for-the-public">https://www.gov.uk/guidance/coronavirus-covid-19-information-for-the-public</a>
- 4. Any child or staff member that becomes ill with symptoms of COVID-19 or that has been in close contact with a person which has been confirmed to have COVID-19 will be excluded following the latest government advice found at <a href="https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/guidance-to-educational-settings-about-covid-19/guidance-to-educational-settings-about-
- 5. Fees will still be payable for any child that is absent from the setting due to sickness of any kind, in line with our terms and conditions.

## **Advice for Parents, Carers and Families**

- Follow all guidance and policies set by Butterflies Childcare and keep up to date with latest government advice.
- 2. If you or child is unwell with fever or cold/flu like symptoms to remain away from the setting until symptoms have passed.
- 3. If you have travelled or have future travel plans abroad then to update the setting as to destination and return dates. If you are travelling to any listed areas on the government specified countries list then you MUST inform the setting before return. - 4. If you have been in contact with anyone with a confirmed or suspected case of COVID-19 then you MUST inform the setting. Appropriate action will be taken dependent on individual circumstances and the current guidance.
- 5. Sanitise hands upon entry to the nursery

## And the most important... exercise good hygiene procedures!

- Wash your and your child's hands regularly using hot, soapy water for at least 20 seconds
  - 2. Avoid touching your and your child's face
  - 3. Use tissues when coughing and sneezing and dispose of safely.
